## **Supplemental Tuition Information Business, Engineering and Computer Science Majors Only**

The University System of Maryland Board of Regents approved a plan to increase tuition for business, engineering and computer science majors over the next four years. The differential will allow these majors to enrich the quality of their programs by increasing faculty, offering more seats to talented students, expanding career and academic services, and elevating national standings.

Tuition will be increased each Fiscal Year (FY), from 2% starting fall 2015 to 15% by fall 2018. To enable students in these three majors to plan in advance, the increases will be phased in incrementally. The breakdown of the increases, for spring and fall semesters only, are:

Students who change their majors to other than business, engineering or computer science during the schedule adjustment period will receive 100% refund of the differential tuition. Changes after the schedule adjustment period will be reflected in the next term.

For example, students who change their majors in October will continue to be charged the tuition differential but not in the spring term. On the flip side, if an ARHU major changes to business, engineering or computer science after the schedule adjustment period, the tuition differential will be charged the following term.
